

A Message from our Pastor



Hi, everyone! We welcome Fr. Patricio to our parish! He told us to call him Fr. Pat. Please give Fr. Pat a warm welcome this weekend! I will have him introduce himself at each Mass. The following weekend is Priesthood Sunday, and we will have light refreshments after each Mass to continue our welcome to Fr. Pat. As I mentioned last week, Nate Menkhaus will also be with us that weekend for Priesthood Sunday. Nate is a seminarian, and he is also Max and Monica's brother! I am very excited to have Nate be a part of this parish as he discerns his vocation to the priesthood.

Each year we participate in the Northeast Ohio's Online Day of Catholic Giving #weGiveCatholic fundraiser. This year it is Tuesday, November 28th. This has been a helpful fundraiser for us in the past. Several years ago, we raised around \$50,000 for the parish office and rectory renovation project which was a huge help in getting that project started. Last year we raised money to help fund the Learning Lodge (the old field house). This project is well under way and almost complete at this point. The Learning Lodge will be used for the school and for parish groups. It can seat up to 100 people and will be a wonderful space to gather for larger groups. The Learning Lodge will also have restrooms attached to it which will provide nice restrooms for those who participate in the many outdoor activities on campus.

This year, after talking with Staff, Parish Council, and Finance Council. I have decided to use the #weGiveCatholic fundraiser to renovate our cafeteria in the school. The cafeteria is used on a regular basis. Of course, the school uses it each day for lunch, but it is also used by many parish groups including Life Teen, Scouts, Donut Sunday, Women's Tea, and the Awaken retreat, just to name a few. The cafeteria needs several updates. The overall look needs refreshed including new ceiling tiles, floor, and paint. There is a leak that needs to be fixed. And many of the appliances need to be replaced. Since this space is so highly used by so many parishioners it would be nice to give it an updated and refreshed look. We were so blessed to update the parish office, rectory, and Learning Lodge. I would really like to keep updating our facilities, especially the ones we use regularly. All of this is a part of the mission of our parish which is to bring people closer to Christ. Having the proper environment and place to gather gives a good first impression and makes people feel at home.

The gifts that are made on Tuesday, November 28, 2023, will increase our impact by allowing us to modernize the cafeteria that so many of our parish organizations and ministries use. Again, from Donut Sunday, Lenten Fish Fry, Knights of Columbus Pancake Breakfast, Family PSR to the St. Barnabas School children, this cafeteria renovation is long overdue and will become a great new meeting space for everyone in our parish community.

My goal is to spread the word so that our Catholic Day of Giving is a great success! Please save the date and support us in this endeavor. We are currently looking for donors who are willing to be matching donors on #weGiveCatholic. With your help, we will reach our goals on #weGIVECatholic Giving Day!



Jesus isn't borina. His Church isn't, either. This phrase resonates throughout the adventures, encounters, activities, and missionary

leadership of the Damascus Catholic Mission Campus. Damascus offers camps, retreats and resources that help people encounter Jesus and live the adventure of the Catholic Faith. The eighth graders in Mrs. Brayer and Mrs. Skelin's classes had the amazing opportunity to attend a retreat at Damascus this past weekend. Many did not know what to expect, but left with a deeper understanding of our faith and a stronger relationship with each other and, more importantly, the Lord. This was an amazing opportunity for the eighth graders to come together as they journey through their last year at St. Barnabas. They had the opportunity to explore the meaning of the sacrament of Confirmation and choose to embrace the fullness of life in Christ - a life that is joyfilled, transformative, and anything but boring. Part of the Damascus philosophy is that faith doesn't just need to be learned, it needs to be lived. Through a series of decision points: turning away from what is holding them back from life, making Jesus the Lord of their life, receiving the gift of new life given through the Spirit, and embracing and living the mission of the Church, many were able to come to a greater understanding of the love the Lord has for each and every one of us. These topics are explored in a high energy environment filled with fellowship, high adventure activities, "club" time, prayer lab, and small group, all in a communal eating and living environment. Damascus Confirmation retreats exist to introduce young people to an experiential understanding of the beauty of the Catholic Church and the adventure of a life lived in relationship with God. God's blessings are abundant at Damascus as it is nestled in the breathtaking beauty of God's environmental blessings. The exact moment remains unclear. It may have been when we witnessed the quietest and most reserved of our students singing loudly while surrounded by classmates. Perhaps it was when our eighth graders rushed the altar to get closer to Jesus during Eucharistic Adoration. It may have been the chorus of thank yous which greeted Mrs. Faetanini Sunday morning. Or, it may have been when one of the missionaries sought out our students and whispered something quickly to each person in their small group before they departed for home. The exact moment is hard to pinpoint. However, make no doubt about it, we witnessed the power of the Holy Spirit this weekend. Please ask an eighth grader about their favorite memory or moment. They definitely have a lot to share and have been changed in profound ways!

Notes from the Blue Army: Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC, tells us, "Mary is the most potent creature ever created. Her holiness makes her so powerful. From the very beginning, God intended to place within her feminine foot the power to crush evil. She did that and continues to do that today. That makes Satan so angry. He hates that he was beaten by such a seemingly insignificant woman. But through her "yes," the Lord gave this young woman from Nazareth the chance to lead us to Christ, to victory over sin and death. That's pretty amazing. When you pray to her, never forget her power. She's the Mother of the Creator, the Spouse of the Holy Spirit, the Mother of Christ. Only the Holy Trinity has more power than she does."

Fr.. Don encourages us to pray the rosary. "It doesn't look like much, But what God sees and what Our Lady sees and what the angels see is that what I'm holding in my hands is a weapon. A powerful weapon. It's a spiritual weapon because the powers that we're up against are not the powers of man," Fr. Calloway explained. "St. Paul says we're in a spiritual battle. So yes, this is a weapon, but a spiritual weapon. The origin of this is from heaven itself." The Rosary is prayed every day at St Barnabas: Sunday at 8:00 a.m.; Monday at 8 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.; Wednesday at 7:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.; Thursday at 7:30 a.m., 6:30 p.m. and 7 p.m.; Friday at 7:45 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.; Saturday at 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. Everyone is welcome!
