

#### A Message from our Pastor



Hi, everyone! I hope you are enjoying this beautiful fall weather. This past week was especially nice. I want to give a huge "thank you" to our fall clean-up crew. There were over 30 volunteers who gave their time to help clean up the landscaping on our campus last weekend. It looks much better! We have a beautiful campus to begin with, but sometimes the bushes, beds, weeds, and leaves can get out of control on this large campus, so the help is much appreciated! One of the volunteers told me, "Father I am happy to help since I consider this my home, too." I thought that was an incredible attitude to have toward this parish and campus. I do hope we can all see this as our home and, as we take care of it, it can become a warm and welcoming place to our visitors and new parishioners.

Speaking of our home, I want to encourage all of you to look at the parish financial statements, census and sacramental statistics for fiscal years ending June 30, 2023 and 2022. We've seen a huge improvement over the two years and it's something to get excited about. You can learn more in the last few pages of the bulletin.

We need to continue to pray for peace in Israel. Pope Francis has asked that Friday, October 27 be a day of prayer and fasting for peace. "Our thoughts turn to Palestine and Israel," the pope said. "The number of victims is rising and the situation in Gaza is desperate. Please, let everything possible be done to avoid a humanitarian disaster. The possible widening of the conflict is disturbing, while so many war fronts are already open in the world. May weapons be silenced and let us heed the cry for peace of the poor, the people, the children. Brothers and sisters, war does not solve any problem: It sows only death and destruction, foments hate, proliferates revenge. War cancels out the future, it cancels out the future. I urge believers to take just one side in this conflict: that of peace. But not in words - in prayer, with total dedication," he concluded.

You may be reading this after October 27th, but please still consider offering prayer and fasting for this intention. Maybe consider making a holy hour before the Blessed Sacrament, coming to pray at a daily Mass this week, or praying a rosary. Or you may just spend some time in prayer at home dedicated to this. Please consider making a small sacrifice for this as well.

This weekend we celebrate Priesthood Sunday in the Diocese of Cleveland. Each year the seminarians go to parishes to share their vocation story on this weekend. We are blessed to have Nate Menkhaus come speak with us. Nate and his family recently became parishioners at St. Barnabas Parish. I am very excited to have him, and we will be seeing him around the parish on his breaks and holidays. And yes, Nate is Max's younger brother! Monica, Nate's sister, also works with us in photography for our marketing team and as one of our Edge ministers. The Menkhaus family has been a major blessing for us, and we warmly welcome Nate as our seminarian! We will have a light reception after each Mass to welcome Nate and Fr. Pat as well.

Please also pray for priests on this Priesthood Sunday. I feel very confident that we benefit greatly from your prayers and support. Please pray we may truly be good shepherds and shepherd rightly but always with the Heart of Christ. I am incredibly grateful to God to be assigned to St. Barnabas and to be your pastor and shepherd!







Dear Parishioners,

Attached you will find the St. Barnabas Parish financial statements, census and Sacramental statistics for the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

The financial results for both the church and school improved year over year. Not only did our collections improve but our expenses decreased. Salaries and benefits showed the most significant drop as we saw changes in our staff. We expect this number to reach and exceed the June 30, 2022 year end amount, mostly due to the expanded staff promised to the parishioners. The school subsidy is down for the third year in a row, a goal set out by members of Finance Council and school personnel. We hope for that to continue.

School income is up due to increases in tuition and enrollment. Note that total school income increased while the subsidy paid to the school dropped. Most of the school expenses were in line with what was expected. In the current year, we are working through many changes as it pertains to Ed Choice. The financials of the school will look different as we will see both an increase to school income and expenses. We expect this to create positive results but at this point, it is too early in the process to gauge exactly how much.

On the statistical information, you will note that the families and persons registered have gone slightly down. This is due more to a cleanup of our database, not a reduction of families. In fact, we are seeing a significant increase in Mass attendance and volunteerism from our families. It is very exciting.

On behalf of everyone at St. Barnabas, thank you for your continued generosity.


