

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Hi, everyone! I would like to thank you all for a wonderful weekend as we celebrated Priesthood Sunday. I really appreciate all your support and words of encouragement. The gift of a spiritual bouquet, organized by Lindsay Fullerman, made up of notes, prayers, and little sacrifices offered for my well-being as a priest, means so much to me. I know it will give me the strength and grace I need to minister here at St. Barnabas. As I have said many times, I am truly grateful to have been sent to St. Barnabas and to be your pastor and shepherd. I would not have picked to be anywhere else at this point in my life and am truly grateful that the Lord sent me here.

I also really enjoyed hearing from our seminarian Nate Menkhaus last weekend. I heard many people offer very affirming feedback about Nate, his presence, and his talk. We are blessed to have Nate and his family at St. Barnabas. Please pray for him as he discerns the priesthood. The vocations' wall that the marketing team has put together by the entrance near the gathering space is meant to remind us of the young men and women from our parish who have said "yes" to discerning God's call to the priesthood or religious life. They have chosen to really put their lives on the line for God in a difficult and very secular world. They need our prayers and support. Please pray for them when you see their pictures, and pray we fill the wall! May each of us give our daily "yes" to God in our respective vocations.

We have a new piece of furniture in the gathering space. For several months now, I have been working with some volunteers and staff to clean and organize our church space and storage. I really want the front entry gathering space to have a warm and welcoming feel as we enter the church. More recently I have been working with the evangelization team to come up with a piece of furniture to have a few quality resources available for parishioners and visitors to take as they enter or exit the church. We are calling this desk a "resource center" which will have resources available like bulletins, QR code, a few books, rosaries etc. I am excited to be able to have an organized space to provide some helpful resources for our parishioners and visitors. I just want to make it clear: the items on the resource center desk will be placed there by staff and be managed by staff. Please do not randomly place items on the resource center desk.

This past week we celebrated All Saints' Day. Often throughout the year the liturgical calendar celebrates the lives of individual Saints. The liturgical calendar only highlights a very small portion of the Saints in Heaven. On All Saints' Day, we have the opportunity to honor all the Saints in Heaven. This may very well include our own deceased relatives and friends. On this feast day we remember two things: First, we believe in the Communion of Saints. All the Saints are fully united with God and therefore participate in Jesus' redemptive mission. Jesus is our Savior, but He often works through holy people to help us in our journey. In marathon running there is no greater feeling and assistance than when people are cheering you on in the race. This is like the "great cloud of witnesses" that the author of Hebrews talks about in Hebrews 12:1. We are surrounded daily by the lives of the Saints and their support and intercession for us. The Saints love us and desire us to be in Heaven with God and each of them forever.

This brings me to my second point. We are all called to be Saints, too. This really is the greatest achievement of life. If we do not achieve Sainthood in Christ then we really have nothing. Saints can intimidate us since they seem to never make mistakes. This certainly is not true. To be a Saint is not to never make a mistake. Rather, to be a Saint is to constantly turn one's life over to Jesus. Saints fearlessly turn to Jesus in their struggles and sins. They trust Jesus loves them in their greatest strengths and failures. Make becoming a Saint your main priority in life. Remember, Jesus says, "seek first the kingdom of God and all these things will be given to you (Matthew 6:33)."

Lastly, we launched a St. Barnabas podcast called "Son of Encouragement" that includes my daily Mass homilies. Saint Barnabas was given the name "son of encouragement" by the apostles because of his kindness, gentleness and compassion towards others. My hope is that you will be encouraged in your daily life by listening. You can access this podcast on the website under the Faith Formation tab. I have had people ask in the past for daily messages to be available for daily inspiration. The daily Mass homilies are being posted in this podcast to allow you all to have a daily message if you would like. We may also be adding more content to the podcast in the future.





Notes from the Blue Army

In 2018, Msgr. Matthew Malnar wrote, "The month of November reminds us of the Communion of Saints. We express our belief in this doctrine each time we say the Apostles' Creed. The Communion of Saints refers to the relationship that binds the Church Militant (the Pilgrim Church on earth), the Church Suffering (the souls in purgatory) and the Church Triumphant (the souls in heaven). The Communion of Saints teaches us that these three aspects of the Catholic Church remain bonded both in life and in death. In particular, the month of November reminds us not to forget our beloved dead. In the Early Church, a chair was left vacant at table, along with a plate and tableware, to remind the family to pray for the repose of the souls of their deceased loved ones. Today, the month of November reminds us to visit the graves of our beloved dead, to gain indulgences to be applied to their souls, to have Masses offered for the repose of their souls and also to pray for the souls in purgatory.

Therefore, during this month of November, let us remember our beloved dead with appropriate religious remembrances. "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen."

The Book of the Names of the Dead

REMEMBERING THE DEAD


Christian communities remember the names of their dead. These names are heard in the Prayer of the Faithful during Mass and in the chanting of the Litany of the Saints at the Easter Vigil. The names of the deceased are seen on holy cards, memorial cards, and grave markers. Masses are prayed for the repose of souls. These rituals and practices serve to keep the memory of those who have gone before us in faith present in our minds and hearts

MONTH OF ALL SOULS

The origins of the solemnity of All Saints (November 1) and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day, November 2) are connected. Honoring the dead dates to prehistoric times and finds expression in various parts of the world, with tributes given to deceased loved ones and veneration of those most worthy offered on the day of their birth. In the pre-Christian Celtic religion, November 1 and 2 were the celebration of their new year, when dead souls would return for a visit.

From the beginnings of the Church, Christians have cherished the memory of those martyred for the faith as icons of Jesus Christ. The small shrines built where the martyrs' remains were buried became places of prayer and pilgrimage. On the anniversary of a martyr's death, the *dies natales*, or birth into the new and heavenly Jerusalem, was commemorated at the tomb, with Eucharist celebrated at dawn on their graves. The martyrs became venerated as disciples and imitators of Christ.

All the saints are celebrated each year on November 1; however, most Christian traditions of honoring the dead are linked with All Souls Day on November 2. On this day, we remember our own loved ones who have gone before us in faith. These tributes extend beyond the day itself and last through the month of November, the Month of All Souls. The days are now at their darkest; crops have been harvested; leaves have changed colors and are falling to the ground; the weather turns cold and bitter, while the readings of the liturgy direct our thoughts to the end times, when Christ will return in his full glory restoring the fullness of salvation to all of creation. What a perfect time to remember our beloved dead!



THE BOOK OF THE NAMES OF THE DEAD

During the Month of All Souls, we give a place of honor to a book in which community members and visitors write the names of their beloved dead. The Book of the Names of the Dead was inspired by the ancient practice of recording the dates of the deaths of loved ones in a necrology, a public record or registry of death. This practice provides the living with an opportunity for healing and consolation in the face of grief.

The Book of the Names of the Dead will be displayed from the solemnity of All Saints until the beginning of Advent. It is left open for people to write the names of their deceased loved ones and for others to read the names, remember, and pray for the repose of their souls The Book of the Names of the Dead will be in the front of the church, in the area of the tabernacle.

Remembering all of these men and women who have gone before us, "marked with the sign of faith," helps us better understand and appreciate our faith in the Christ our risen Lord who conquers sin and death and brings new life to all.




