

#### A Message from our Pastor



Hi, everyone! I again want to thank everyone for an awesome gathering of community last weekend for the Bourbon raffle! We had a beautiful evening with a great turnout. We raised around \$100,000. The money will go to help reduce the subsidy paid by the church to the school for tuition. Thank you to all who helped run this raffle and make it a great evening!

The Gospel for this weekend focuses on forgiveness. This is something we hear of a lot so we know it well in our minds but it can be difficult to actually forgive. And Jesus finishes the parable for this weekend by saying, "So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart (Matthew 18:35)." Why is forgiveness so important? Why does Jesus care so much about us forgiving each other?

Our first reading from Sirach sets the stage well for why forgiveness is so important. This line in particular jumps out to me: "Could anyone nourish anger against another and expect healing from the Lord?" In other words, the writer of Sirach helps us to see that we cannot expect inner healing if we are unwilling to let go of anger in our hearts. Soaking in this internal anger will prevent us from being truly ourselves. It will affect our mood, our thoughts, and our actions. We become resentful and bitter. We can become very unpleasant to be around. And worst of all this internal anger is like a poison to our own soul and psychological and spiritual well-being. We will have trouble hearing God within our own soul if anger is being intentionally nourished and harbored.

Forgiveness is important because it helps us to heal. It helps our own hearts to be freed of the inner anger. It helps God's grace to flow more freely within our own selves. Forgiveness helps us to come back to life again. And it certainly will help us to begin restoring the broken relationship that is suffering from hurt. How do I forgive when it is difficult to forgive?

There can be many insights and ways to begin the process of forgiveness when it is difficult. What does this weekend's Gospel have to say about that? Well, the parable that Jesus tells in Matthew 18:21-35 helps to put things in perspective. Sometimes we lose the larger perspective when we are hurt. The parable reminds us that God forgives us a much larger debt than we ever have to forgive anyone ourselves. If I am struggling to forgive perhaps the first good step is to prayerfully look at the crucifix and remember that Jesus saved me, a sinner, from hell. Jesus paid an eternal debt for me. He paid a huge price for me and has truly forgiven me of my sins. We receive this forgiveness through the sacraments of baptism and reconciliation. When I begin to remember the large debt that Jesus forgave me then it will help me to forgive the smaller debt that my brother has against me. Sometimes it can still be difficult to forgive. I would recommend a few things. Tell Jesus about the anger you feel. Invite Him into that wound and place of hurt. Ask Him to give you the grace of being able to forgive the way He does. Lastly, talk with someone you trust about your pain and hurt. Then ask that person to pray with you.

Please always trust that Jesus has the power to heal your heart!





PUTS WOMEN AT RISK. Current Ohio laws require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a 'burden' and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion." 




