

A Message from our Pastor



Hi, everyone! I am excited to announce that I hired a youth minister this past week. Matt Bobby will begin Sunday, October 1st. Matt will introduce himself at Mass some time in the next month or so and you will have a chance to meet him. If you get a chance to meet him, please welcome him to St. Barnabas Parish!

On Saturday September 23 we celebrate the feast day of St. Padre Pio. I have Mass for the Padre Pio prayer group on the vigil which is Friday the 22nd. This prayer group has been affiliated with St. Barnabas in the past and is currently affiliated with Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish. But the point is they have a strong devotion to Padre Pio and seek his intercession.

St. Padre Pio was born in Italy in 1887 and died in 1968. He is truly a great saint and is a great miracle worker. He was a Capuchin Franciscan monk for most of his life and resided in San Giovanni Rotonda in Italy. Padre Pio was blessed by the Lord and had tremendous spiritual gifts. He had the stigmata (wounds of Christ on his hands and feet) for around 50 years. He was known to be able to "read souls" in the confessional, and had the ability to bilocate (be in two places at once). There are many physical healings attributed to his intercession.

Padre Pio also suffered a lot in his life. During the first World War Padre Pio was praying and felt the call to offer himself to the Lord for the sins and bloodshed of the war. This is when the stigmata first appeared for Padre Pio. He was offering himself in union with Jesus' offering for humanity on the cross. In Colossians 1:24 St. Paul writes, "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the Church." This reminds me of the offering of St. Padre Pio.

It is very important to note that Padre Pio had a very deep love for Jesus. He was a man of prayer and love. He helped many people who were tormented with illness - mental, spiritual, and physical suffering. He had a hospital built close to the monastery to care for the sick. He started prayer groups which are still in effect today like the one I mentioned earlier.

When I was going through my own conversion process and discerning where God was calling me in my life, Padre Pio played a very significant role. I enjoyed reading about his life and the miracles, and frequently sought his intercession. But most of all I was inspired by Padre Pio's deep love for God and how he made a total offering of his life to Jesus on a regular basis. This really caught my attention and was something I desired in my own life. I too wanted to make an offering of my life to the Lord. Not too long after this I really felt Jesus calling me to the priesthood. This would be the way He was calling me to make my life an offering to Him.

Have you offered your life to Jesus?

Really, we do this every time we go to Mass and kneel before the altar. But it would be good to consciously make our life an offering to Jesus. Perhaps we are drawn to offer our lives for our families, or for some particular cause in the world. Where is the Holy Spirit stirring in you to allow yourself to love God more fully and really make a conscious offering to God?



Notes from the Blue Army: Brother Stephen, MIC, tells about a time as a hungry 12 year old boy, he kept with his family's practice of fasting on Fridays for an end to abortion. "I struggled as we ate our meager lunch and began to set up for our home-school drama club practice. However, when my friends began to arrive, I reached deep into myself and pulled out a little spark of joy. This spark held me up through that difficult afternoon. There was a spiritual reason why I had the power, even at 12, to make sacrifices. Every Friday, Mom took my brothers and me to noon Mass at our parish. Afterward, the pastor would lead the Stations of the Cross composed by St. Alphonsus Liguori. To this day, I recall the words that conclude each of Liquori's prayers: "I love You, Jesus, my love, with my whole heart. I repent of ever having offended You. Never permit me to offend You again. Grant that I may love You always, and then do with me what You will." And every station concluded by invoking the Sorrowful Mother with the beautiful chant of the Stabat Mater:

> At the Cross her Station keeping Stood the mournful Mother, weeping, Close to Jesus to the last.

Over the years, these words gradually sank in to my heart, and I perceived (just a little) how Our Lady suffered with her Son. She, the Sorrowful Mother, is a model of compassionate love and suffering for us. And this lesson was reflected by my earthly mother: She fasted with us without complaining, sustained by a little spark within. This spiritual attitude toward suffering stands in vivid contrast to the world. It is a sign of our hope. As St. Paul says, "We rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint". Suffering conforms us to Christ and to His Sorrowful Mother." Our Lady of Sorrows, Pray for us!


